## Start of the Day

- Students can be dropped off at the playground at 8:05 without supervision, students must be with a guardian prior to this. This includes walkers, bikers and kiss and go.
- 8:10 is the first bell and 8:15 is the tardy bell. All students who come to school after 8:15 will need to get a pass from the front office.
- 4th and 5th grade will enter & exit through the south doors on the playground.

- 3:15 Dismissal students may not stay and play without an adult present.
- Supervision will end at 3:25 and all remaining students will be taken to the office to contact family.

### Kiss and Go Reminders

- Please remember that all pick ups and drop off will be done on the NORTH side of Iowa
- We do not want anyone crossing the street unless at a crosswalk.
- Safety for ALL is our priority.

#### **Supplies**

If you ordered supplies for your child, they should arrive on the first day of school. If you did not order a box, no worries, here is a <u>list of supplies</u> that we are requesting. We are asking that students bring school supplies on the first day of school instead of Back to School night. If your child needs any support in getting supplies or if you would like to donate extra supplies, please contact us directly and we will work to ensure all students have a successful start to the school year.

#### **Snacks and Treats:**

• <u>Birthday Celebrations:</u> Cory has a no-food policy for celebrating all birthdays. Students will enjoy their special day at school and will get to <u>visit the office to receive a book to keep for their birthday treat!</u> Please save special food treats for celebrations at home.

- <u>Snacks:</u> We will have an opportunity for a small snack every morning. If your child would like to have a snack, please send them to school with something that is healthy and easy to eat (no utensils required, etc). Cheese sticks, granola bars, or small bags of pretzels/goldfish are good options.
- <u>Drinks:</u> Please send your child with a water bottle that closes tightly. No other drinks (gatorade, iced tea, lemonade, etc) will be allowed in the classroom, but students can bring those types of beverages for lunch if they choose!
